One Night at Glenlough is a new play by **Shaun Byrne** which premieres in the Balor Arts Centre, as part of the Donegal Bay and Blue Stacks Festival.

The plot deals with the summer acclaimed Welsh poet Dylan Thomas spent in Donegal in 1935, in the remote coastal region of Glenlough, near Glencolmcille.

Sent there on a retreat by his publisher after the overnight success of his first collection, this dark comedy follows Thomas's attempts to both dry out and compose new work, both of which are met with mixed results.

Visited in his remote cottage hideaway by Liam the Post, he finds himself battling demons real and imagined in this 'virtual poteen republic', as Thomas described his new home in a letter to a friend.

Featuring acclaimed Ballybofey actor **Frankie McCafferty** as Liam and rising star **Aidan Moriarty** as Dylan Thomas with visionary direction by **Charlie Bonner**, this promises to be one not to be missed.

Frankie McCafferty is one of Donegal's finest actors. His distinguished career has seen him work with almost every major Irish theatre company







including The Abbey Theatre (The Plough and The Stars), Druid (The Black Pig's Dyke) and The Lyric, Belfast (Conversations On A Homecoming, Molly Sweeney, Waiting for Godot, The Playboy of the Western World and Observe The Sons of Ulster Marching Towards the Somme)

His Film and TV roles include Philomena, Angela's Ashes, In The Name Of The Father Ballykissangel, Vikings, Ripper Street, Derry Girls and, most recently, Blue Lights.

Aidan Moriarty has earned many plaudits in a relatively short acting career to-date. Donegal audiences will have seen him in The Abbey Theatre / Lyric Theatre, Belfast co-production of Brian Friel's Translations, as well as in An Grianán Theatre's production of Friel's The Enemy Within, part of the Colmcille 1500 celebrations in 2021.

Charlie Bonner is a well-known actor and director from Ballybofey. He has performed in all of the leading theatres in Ireland including the Abbey Theatre (Philadelphia, Here I Come !, Macbeth) and The Lyric Belfast (Dancing At Lughnasa, The Playboy of The Western World).

For last year's festival, Charlie directed the hugely successful Civil War play, Drumboe (written by Kieran Kelly), which sold out its four night run at the Balor Arts Centre.

Shaun Byrne is an actor and playwright from Ballybofey, whose work has enjoyed tremendous success on the festival circuit.

Earlier this year, Ballyshannon Drama Society won their way to the RTÉ All Ireland Drama Festival in Athlone with his play, Margaret, on the life and times of Margaret Thatcher, with Best Actress Award-winning Rachel O'Connor in the title role.

Johnathan Ball is a Kinlough-based craftsman working in glass and metal. Concepta Boyce uses a combination of traditional and digital techniques in her work. Donagh Gorman is a surf photographer and maker living in Bundoran. Lisa Callaghan's work explores the connections between art, place and mental health. Aisling Clarke draws inspiration from coastal culture, plants and wildlife.

Kevin Lowery is driven to paint the rolling surf and ever changing skies around him. **Vicky Crawford** is a printmaker and musician, living in Drumkeeran. **Rory Gill** is an oil painter who lives on the Donegal Fermanagh border. **Gavin McCrea** is an artist and surfer, formerly of Tyrone. Originally from the South of England, **Christine Harrison** is a multi-disciplinary artist, now living in Donegal.

With a background in classical and traditional music, she spent seven years as lead uilleann piper, whistle and concertina player in Riverdance, with whom she toured to over thirty countries across Europe, Asia. America and Canada. She was also a



featured soloist on the Riverdance 25th Anniversary album and DVD, which was recorded with the RTÉ Concert Orchestra.

Tara's other musical collaborations include the Grammy-nominated Afro Celt Sound System as well as performances with Sir James Galway, Bill Whelan, Steve Cooney and Sharon Shannon.

Since embarking on a solo career, Tara completed her first headline tour of Ireland to great acclaim last year as well as issuing a remarkable EP, Down by The Sally Gardens, with Malaysian saxophonist and uilleann piper **Faliq Auri**, which has been streamed in over 180 countries. Her current CD, Tara Howley Take 2, includes the Itunes hit, Outlawed Tunes on Outlawed, as well as beautiful interpretations of classic Irish and Scottish folk songs including Raglan Road, She Moved Through The Fair and The Skye Boat Song.

Aoibhín O'Dea is a young fiddle player and singer from Gaoth Dobhair. She learned her music from local musicians and singers,

performing from a young age with highly accomplished traditional ensemble An Crann Óg, under the guidance of Caitlín Joe Jack Uí Dhuibhir.

Conor Caldwell is a fiddle player from Belfast who is currently Course Director for the MA in Irish Traditional Music Performance at the Irish World Academy in the University of Limerick. His collaboration with fellow fiddler Danny Diamond, North, was described as a 'long-playing delight' by Siobhán Long in The Irish Times.

Conor's latest release, Oh Listen To The Band, is an exploration of the influence of the emerging jazz idioms of the 1920s on Irish traditional music of the time. The recording features archival material from legendary performers such as John Doherty, Josie McDermott and Con Cassidy, which he has re-imagined with contemporary traditional and jazz musicians.

Bruce MacGregor, a native of Inverness, is a pupil of the legendary fiddle teacher Donald Riddell MBE. He formed the multi-award winning Highland fiddle super group Blazin' Fiddles in 1998. Still going strong, they were voted Best Folk Band at the Scots Trad Music Awards last year.

Bruce also composes music for theatre, film, television and, latterly, for computer games, including the hit computer game, Assassin's Creed III, which will doubtless attract a whole new audience to this year's Glenties Fiddlers Gathering!



The Factory Girls is the play that brought Buncrana playwright, Frank McGuinness to national and international prominence.

Set in a struggling clothing factory in Donegal, matters come to a head when the owner demands a particularly onerous hike in productivity - 'a dozen



shirts in 13 minutes' - from his long-serving, all female staff. A strike is threatened and when the union rep from Dublin fails to calm the situation, the girls down tools and stage a sit-in in the boss's office, with mixed results.
